Re: Entergy Services, Inc. -- ER07-____ -- Revisions to Open Access Transmission Tariff to Incorporate NAESB WEQ Standards

Dear Ms. Salas:

Pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act and Part 35 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's regulations, 18 C.F.R. Part 35 (2006), and in compliance with the Commission's directives in *Standards for Business Practices and Communication Protocols for Public Utilities*, Order No. 676, issued on April 25, 2006 in Docket No. RM05-5-000, Entergy Services, Inc. ("Entergy"), on behalf of the Entergy Operating Companies hereby submits for filing the original and five copies of revised pages to the Entergy Open Access Transmission Tariff ("Entergy OATT"), Entergy FERC Electric Tariff, Second Revised Volume No. 3.

This filing consists of the following documents:

- 1. this transmittal letter;
- 2. First Revised Sheet No. 29 and Original Sheet Nos. 29A and 29B of the Entergy OATT, incorporating the North American Energy Standards Board ("NAESB") Wholesale Electric Quadrant ("WEQ") standards; and

Standards for Business Practices and Communication Protocols for Public Utilities, Order No. 676, 115 FERC ¶ 61,102 (2006).

The Entergy Operating Companies include Entergy Arkansas, Inc., Entergy Gulf States, Inc., Entergy Louisiana, LLC, Entergy Mississippi, Inc., and Entergy New Orleans, Inc.

3. redlined versions of Sheet Nos. 29, 29A and 29B of the Entergy OATT, highlighting the changes that are the subject of this filing.

I. Background

On April 25, 2006, in Docket No. RM05-5-000, the Commission issued an order amending its regulations to incorporate by reference certain standards promulgated by the Wholesale Electric Quadrant ("WEQ") of the North American Energy Standards Board ("NAESB")³. Specifically, Order No. 676 requires the adoption and incorporation by reference of the following NAESB WEQ Standards:

- WEQ-001 "Business Practices for Open Access Same-time Information Systems (OASIS)" (except certain provisions specifically excluded by the Commission);
- WEQ-002 "Business Practices for Open Access Same-time Information System (OASIS) Standards & Communications Protocols;"
- WEQ-003 "Open Access Same-time Information Systems (OASIS) Data Dictionary;"
- WEQ-004 "Coordinate Interchange Standards;"
- WEQ-005 "Area Control Error (ACE) Equation Special Cases Standards;"
- WEQ-006 "Manual Time Error Correction Standards;" and
- WEQ-007 "Inadvertent Interchange Payback Standards."

The Commission directed each utility to modify its open access tariff to include the WEQ Standards the next time such utility made any unrelated filing to revise its OATT.⁴ Entergy is making this filing in compliance with the directive.

II. The Instant Filing

In compliance with Order No. 676, Entergy hereby submits tariff sheets adopting the WEQ Standards. The WEQ Standards are included as new Section 4.1 to the Entergy OATT, First Revised Sheet No. 29, and Original Sheet Nos. 29A and 29B. The revised pages of the Entergy OATT submitted herewith incorporate the NAESB WEQ Standards by reference, using the language the Commission directed utilities to use for this purpose. Entergy does not believe that adoption of the NAESB WEQ Standards requires any changes or revisions to existing OATT provisions.

Consistent with the requirements of Order No. 676, Entergy requests that the Commission accept the revisions to the Entergy OATT to incorporate the NAESB WEQ Business Practice Standards to be effective as of July 1, 2006. To the extent necessary, Entergy requests any waivers of the Commission's regulations necessary to allow the revisions submitted herewith to be accepted to become effective as of the dates specified above.

IV. Other Filing Requirements

Entergy believes that this filing satisfies all of the Commission's filing requirements and regulations. To the extent that Entergy is incorrect, Entergy respectfully requests any waiver of those requirements and regulations necessary to allow the Commission to accept the revisions to the Entergy OATT submitted herewith to be effective as of the date specified above.

5 Local Furnishing Bonds


Furnishing Bonds: This provision is applicable only to Transmission

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Tariff, the Transmission Provider shall not be required to provide transmission service to any Eligible Customer pursuant to this Tariff if the provision of such transmission service would jeopardize the tax-exempt status of any local furnishing bond(s) used to finance the Transmission Providers facilities that would be used in providing such transmission service.
