
In accordance with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's Regulations, set forth at 18 C.F.R. § 358.4, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby files this report of deviation from the Standards of Conduct due to emergency situation. On February 26, 2008, FPL suffered a large electric outage. Shortly after the electric outage, FPL posted a notice on its OASIS stating:

Effective immediately, FPL, may as appropriate, share with its Energy Affiliates, including FPL's internal Marketing Affiliate which is FPL Energy Marketing & Trading, information necessary to respond to the power outages that began this afternoon on its system and to maintain the operations and reliability of its transmission system.

FPL was able to terminate its emergency status by approximately 6:00 pm February 25th, and is at this time investigating the cause of the equipment failure. To the best of FPL's knowledge, deviation from the Standards of Conduct occurred with respect to only two employees. The Vice President Energy Marketing & Trading and the Director of Wholesale Operations each attended two meetings during the outage at which the status of FPL's generation and line outage and restoration process were discussed. Their attendance at this meeting was required as they each have specialized knowledge of the generation load requirements for FPL's wholesale customers as well as the availability and characteristics of purchased power in the wholesale markets. This knowledge was needed to assist in the coordination of restoration service to FPL's customers and was a material contributor in the rapid restoration of service.

FPL's transmission system has now been stabilized and restored, and as of 6:00 pm on February 26, 2008, the Standards of Conduct were reinstated.
