



Business Practice: Capacity Reassignment

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Overview

Section 23 of Portland General Electric's (PGE's) Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT") sets forth the terms and conditions for the reassignment of transmission capacity on PGE's Transmission System. This business practice clarifies how PGE will implement Section 23. This business practice, as such may be modified from time to time, will govern all capacity reassignment transactions on PGE's Transmission System until NAESB develops additional business practice standards for capacity reassignment.

Definitions

1. Assignee: an Eligible Customer to whom PGE has sold, assigned or transferred all or a portion of its rights under a Service Agreement.
2. Reseller: A Transmission Customer that sells, assigns or transfers its rights under its Service Agreement.

Business Practice

1. General Information
 - A Transmission Customer may sell, assign, or transfer all or a portion of its rights under its Service Agreement, but only to another Eligible Customer.
 - All capacity reassignments are subject to the terms and conditions in PGE's OATT.
2. Procedure for Reassigning Capacity
 - The Assignee must execute a service agreement with PGE prior to the date on which the reassigned service commences.
 - A copy of the form of service agreement that is to be used for both long-term and short term capacity reassignments is included as Attachment A-1 to PGE's OATT. The Assignee must complete and execute a service agreement for reassignment, including, as applicable, specifications for reassignment of long-term firm point-to-point transmission service included on pages 3 and 4 of Attachment A-1.

- An executed service agreement for reassignment must be received by PGE no later than the following:
 - For hourly service, 2 hours before the Latest Request time provided under “Timing Requirements for Transmission Service Requests” as described in PGE’s Open Access Transmission Tariff and OASIS Business Practices (OASIS Business Practices).
 - For any service other than hourly, 2 business days before the Latest Request time described in the OASIS Business Practices.

- Prior to executing a service agreement with the Assignee, PGE will review the Assignee’s creditworthiness in accordance with the Creditworthiness Procedures set forth in Attachment L of PGE’s OATT.

- The reassignment of capacity must occur on the OASIS. The transmission service request (TSR) must be of a service type of RESALE. The TSR must be queued and acted on by PGE and the Assignee pursuant to PGE’s OATT, North American Energy Standards Board (“NAESB”) business practice standards and PGE’s OASIS Business Practices. If PGE has not received an executed service agreement for reassignment by the time specified above, the RESALE TSR will be marked INVALID. The OASIS TSR shall include the following terms of the reassignment and serve as PGE’s required posting on its OASIS:
 - The Reseller
 - The Assignee
 - The amount of capacity reassigned
 - The term of the reassignment
 - The start and end dates
 - The price
 - The points of receipt and delivery

- The execution of a service agreement by the Assignee and PGE does not itself terminate the Reseller’s service agreement. The Reseller’s service agreement with PGE remains in place.

3. Billing

- During the term of the assignment, the Reseller will continue to be billed under its agreement with PGE under the same billing process PGE follows for its invoicing of transmission service under its OATT.

- PGE will credit the Reseller the reassignment rate, which leaves the Reseller with the net difference between the resale rate and the Reseller’s original rate.

- If the Assignee defaults and fails to pay for the reassigned capacity, PGE will reverse the credit to the Reseller to reflect the lack of payment by the Assignee.
