

Process for Adding, Deleting or Modifying Rules, Standards and Practices Posted on TANC's Website

TANC posts on its website or OASIS rules, standards and practices that relate to services that are offered to meet the reciprocity requirements established by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. These rules, standards and practices are not included in TANC's Tariff. TANC is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

Initiation of Process

A process for adding, deleting or modifying TANC's rules, standards and practices may be triggered by:

1. A change in TANC's business practices or operations;
2. Actions by the Western Electricity Coordinating Council that TANC determines may warrant a change;
3. Actions by the North American Electric Reliability Council that TANC determines may warrant a change;
4. A proposed modification by a TANC Member;
5. A proposed modification by a customer;
6. A review by TANC; or
7. Actions by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission that impact the applicable rules, standards and practices or the reciprocal nature of TANC's OATT.

Review and Approval

- A. Unless otherwise required by law or required to resolve urgent reliability issues, all additions, deletions or modifications of TANC's rules, standards and practices will be placed on the appropriate TANC committee agenda on TANC's website, and with a corresponding link for access via the OASIS.
- B. TANC will consider comments on proposed additions, deletions or modifications to TANC's rules, standards and practices prior to appropriate TANC committee approval of the proposed revision.
- C. Approved additions, deletions or modifications to TANC's rules, standards and practices will be posted promptly on TANC's website or OASIS, indicating the effective date, prior to TANC's implementation unless otherwise required by law or urgent reliability considerations.
- D. TANC's rules, standards and practices will reflect a record of additions, deletions or modifications of TANC's rules, standards and practices.
